# PROTECT YOURSELF

prevention is always key

- Always check for unfamiliar transactions on bank statements
- Shred all documents containing sensitive information using a cross cut shredder before throwing them away
- Look into mail that goes missing
- · Carry out regular personal credit report checks
- Redirect post for at least six months when moving house
- Limit the amount of information shared when using social networking sites





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
