Follow our four steps on what to do if you think you have been scammed, you're concerned about an investment or you have been contacted by fraudsters



It can be easy to fall for an investment scam: the people that run them are skilled and experienced at persuading targets to part with their money



If you think you have been contacted about a scam or paid money to fraudsters, there are steps you can take to protect yourself and help stop them for good



STOP SENDING MONEY

If you think you have been scammed you should stop sending money to the firm and individuals involved

If you have given them your bank account details, tell your bank immediately







BREATHE



INFORM

REPORT THE SCAM TO ACTION FRAUD & THE POLICE

Action Fraud will especially be interested if you sent money to a bank account or by another type of money transfer

BE AWARE YOU MAY BE TARGETED AGAIN

If you have been the victim of a scam, or simply been contacted by fraudsters, you may be targeted again

Fraudsters will take advantage of you by:
